Ms Ranyard will be working with specific children and Bonnie in her Dog Mentor role each week, but all children will benefit from Bonnie being in school.



We have been working on the following:

- Greeting Bonnie in a calm manner, not calling her name
- Asking first if we are allowed to touch Bonnie
- Making sure that only two hands are on Bonnie at any time
- We don't feed Bonnie any food
- We don't pick Bonnie up Paws on the floor!
