Tapestry E-Journal Download

Dear Parents/Carers,

This year parents will be able to download their child's e-journal from tapestry themselves. We have created your journal as a zip file within your own Tapestry Log In area. To access your child's e-journal zip file you will need to first log in using your normal tapestry username and password and then click on your name on the top right hand side. Next, click "Downloads" where you will find a copy of your child's e-journal for you to save or print. This file will be active until Sunday 26th July.

All e-journals will be activated on Sunday 12th July, therefore parents have time to save or print their journal. After the 26th July all recorded data about your child will be erased from the system so please ensure you save or print your child's e-journal before the link expires. The last date for download will be **Sunday 26th July 2020**.


Day One

Learning Objective: Writing - Owl Babies


Listen to the story of 'Owl Babies' or read the book if you have a copy of it. (This story has been chosen to get ready to move into a new class and go back to school)

Today your task is all about doubling an amount.

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
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
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If you have a mirror, use it to support doubling (like the picture below). Then write the number sentence showing the doubling.

Begin doubling numbers up to 5, if your child is confident with this, double numbers up to 10.





Learning Objective: Maths - Creative doubling

Today is a creative maths task.

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
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
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- 1- Fold your paper in half
- 2- Write a number between 1 and 10 on one side.
 - 3- Print/paint that number of spots
 - 4- Fold the paper over.
- 5- Now count how many spots you have altogether
 - 6- This is called doubling a number.

Repeat this for different amounts, can your child guess how many there is going to be altogether?






Learning Objective: Maths - Halving an amount

Create your own halving mat like the one below.

Can you halve different amounts. Use the words half, equal, share, same amount, fair. You can use small objects to help you - buttons, pasta, small toys, grapes, raisins.

Start with numbers up to 10 and if your child is confident, challenge them with numbers up to 20.



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




Today I would like you to measure yourself with a piece of string.
