#### Year 3 & Year 4 Spelling Lists

#### **Alphabetising Animals Challenge**

There are three different levels of challenge for this activity. Cut out the cards in one set at a time and challenge your child to order the cards in alphabetical order. Once they've done these, why not generate a new list of words around a topic your child is studying, or one that interests them, and create your own version!

#### **Reading Question Matrix**

Making sure that children understand what they are reading is just as important as making sure they can read the words. Every time you read a story with your child, whether they read to you or you read to them, choose a few questions from this Reading Question Matrix to see how well they have understood the text.
