Home Learning:

It is expected that ...

- Children practise some **Maths** skills throughout the week (NumBots) this can be games at home such as counting, sorting, following routines, measuring and weighing or playing board games.
- Children **read** with an adult for a minimum of 5 minutes every day.
- A 'Homework Menu' will be sent home at the beginning of each half term. Please email/ tweet/ send in via google classroom or bring in work to share at the end of each half term.

Our theme this term is... What makes me special?

In **Geography** we will be learning about our local area and the different landmarks we can spot. We will design and build playground in **D&T** after our trip to the Berry Avenue playground. We will also learn about the five senses in **Science** and learn which body part is linked to each sense. In **English** lessons our writing will be based on stories and poems about being outdoors including 'Percy the Parkeeper' by Nick Butterworth, 'On the way home' by Jill Murphy, 'The secret sky garden' by Linda Sarah 'Out and About' by Shirley Hughes and 'Where's my Teddy?' by Jez Alborough. In **Maths** lessons we will learn about number patterns, become confident at counting, ordering and estimating. We will start to use part whole models when adding and subtracting within 10 and will begin to solve problems. We will produce self portraits in **Art** lessons. In **History** we will learn about timelines and create a timeline of our lives so far. In our **RE** lessons we will learn about being thankful and giving to charity. We will sing songs in **Music**, learn basic **Spanish** greetings and use the BeeBots and Chromebooks in **Computing**.

We will answer these questions:	
Who makes up my family?	What tree is my class named after and what do I know about it?
What do I look like?	How can I use different resources to produce a self portrait?
Which body parts do I know?	What is the link between my body and my senses?
Where do I live?	What are the names of our local streets?
What is near the school?	Where are our local parks?
What do children like at the playground?	Which resources can I use to design a playground?

We would appreciate if you could send in a photograph of your home and a photograph of your family by **Friday 17**th **September** so we can use it in class.

Please let us know if you have any useful information or resources which you would be willing to share with us. **Playground:**

We are in the process of updating the KS1 playground for children to use at playtime, lunchtime and as part of their lessons outdoors. We hope this will be a fantastic space to help the children investigate, learn and enjoy If you have any of the following items that you would be willing to donate, please drop these at the Birch class door for Miss Wolstencroft.

- Toys for our sand and water trays
- Spades and digging equipment for our bark area
- Outdoor storage of any kind
- Materials for den building (wooden pallets, milk crates, tyres, off cuts of decking, logs)
- Cushions/bean bags for the reading area

We have been kindly donated some playhouse panels which we would like to turn into a playhouse, if anyone in our school community is able to donate their time to place a simple wooden roof on top please let us know.
