Theme: Why is water vital to how our world works?

This half term we are answering the question “ Why is water vital to how our world works?” in our Theme lessons. We will be investigating the water cycle and how water molds the world we live in. In science, we are learning about states of matter and how materials, solids, liquids and gases can change. Our book for English this term is Monster Slayer by Brian Patten and Chris Riddell, to inspire us with our writing. We will also be reading James and the Giant Peach in our Reading lessons, a great book full of adventures and wonderful characters. We have so many great things planned to do with the children during this term in Year 4 and are looking forward to learning together!

As well as the homework menu, we expect children to complete other tasks throughout as below.

Reading	Daily	Please read at home daily. This could be a shared read with a member of your family, an opportunity for you to read to an adult in your family as well as time to quietly read and enjoy a good book on your own. Share with your family the books we are reading in class and keep them up to date with events as they unfold!
Maths	Daily	In Year 4, children should practise the 6, 7 and 9 times tables up to 12×6 , 7 and 9 and corresponding division facts (e.g. $30 \div 6 = 5$). You can use chanting, singing, copying out the tables or practise using online games and apps. Spelling	Daily	Look at the spelling list and practise the spellings. Can you put these spellings into sentences? When reading look out for words with our spelling pattern and add them to the list. Use your home learning book to practise your spellings.
Handwriting	Whenever you're writing in your Home Learning book	Use your spelling homework to practise your best handwriting. Remember to use an appropriate writing utensil.
