Theme: Why did the Romans have a great empire?

During this half term we will be exploring history and changes that have happened over time. We are focussing on the Roman Empire, if it really was great, and the impact this had on our lives today. In Science this term we are learning all about Teeth and Digestion. We will investigate the digestive system and all about teeth and their function. Our book for English this term is Escape from Pompeii and The General, to inspire us with our writing. We will also be reading The Firework Maker's Daughter in our Reading lessons, a beautiful book about adevntures and discovery. We have so many great things planned to do with the children during this term in Year 4 and are looking forward to learning together!

Reading	Daily	Please read at home daily. This could be a shared read with a member of your family, an opportunity for you to read to an adult in your family as well as time to quietly read and enjoy a good book on your own. Share with your family the books we are reading in class and keep them up to date with events as they unfold!			
Maths	Daily	In Year 4, children should practise the 6, 7 and 9 times tables up to 12 x 6, 7 and 9 and corresponding division facts (e.g. 30 ÷ 6 = 5). You can use chanting, singing, copying out the tables or practise using online games and apps. Spelling	Daily	Look at the spelling list and practise the spellings.Can you put these spellings into sentences? When reading look out for words with our spelling pattern and add them to the list. Use your home learning book to practise your spellings.			
Handwriting	Whenever you're writing in your Home Learning book	Use your spelling homework to practise your best handwriting. Remember to use an appropriate writing utensil.
