Home Learning Spring 2 Year 4



Theme: How do you know where you are?

This half term we will be looking at famous landmarks around the world, their geographical locations and history. In Science we will be looking at climate and the effects of climate chang on our planet. Our book for English is The Man Who Walked Between the Towers by Mordicai Gerstein, to inspire us with our writing. We will also be reading The Borrowers by Mary Norton. We have so many great things planned to do with the children during this term in Year 4 and are looking forward to learning together!

As well as the homework menu, we expect children to complete other tasks throughout as below.					
Reading	Daily	Please read at home daily. This could be a shared read with a member of your family, an opportunity for you to read to an adult in your family as well as time to quietly read and enjoy a good book on your own. Share with your family the books we are reading in class and keep them up to date with events as they unfold!			
Maths	Daily	In Year 4, children should practise the 6, 7, 8 and 9 times tables up to 12 x 6, 7, 8 and 9 and corresponding division facts (e.g. 30 ÷ 6 = 5). You can use chanting, singing, copying out the tables or practise using online games and apps. Spelling	Daily	Look at the spelling list and practise the spellings.Can you put these spellings into sentences? When reading look out for words with our spelling pattern and add them to the list. Use your home learning book to practise your spellings.			
Handwriting	Whenever you're writing in your Home Learning book!	Use your spelling homework to practise your best handwriting. Will you write in pen or pencil?
