Research about one form of renewable energy and how it may be used to generate electricity for use around your home.



Write a shape poem about your favourite animal. How do they look? How do they move? Do they have emotions?



Write a letter to Miss Tyler persuading her as to why we should have forest school every week. Think about persuasive language and the pros of working outside.



Record the physical activity you do every week. Do you think you do enough? If not, go for a bike ride, scoot around the block, or try jogging (you will soon get your steps up!).



Create a menu of elegant Victorian food to impress your dinner guests. You may also want to write down what entertainment would be on offer (such as parlour games, singing and playing the piano etc.).

Design an invention for something that could be used in your home to create renewable energy (such as a small wind turbine or a rain machine that can be used to harness the British weather).



Design and produce a brochure for a resort that you are going to open on the Moon. What would you have in your resort that would make it stand out? For example, would you have a zero-gravity mini-golf or a water slide that careers you into the Moon's orbit?



Whilst reading a book, keep a diary of how the character feels throughout. Do their feelings change? Why is this? How have they developed as a character?



Sit outside in your garden or the park and describe how nature is changing as we enter Autumn and begin to look forward to Winter.
