<p>Write a poem in the style of Clodbusting by Malorie Blackman, about someone who has made an impact on your time at Cherry Tree School. It can be another member of your class or an adult who has taught or supported you during your time here.</p> 	<p>Imagine you are working as an assistant to Thomas Edison. He has just invented the light bulb and needs your help publicising his creation. Design an advertising poster introducing his invention and sharing the benefits of it for Victorian households.</p> 	<p>There are more than 250 lighthouses still in use across the UK, whose shining beams of light play a vital role in protecting shipping. Find and research a working lighthouse. Where is it? When was it built? How is it used today? With the days of the lighthouse keeper long gone, who looks after it?</p> 	<p>Make shadow pictures by arranging objects in front of a blank wall or piece of paper. Shine a light behind the objects and notice the shadow picture you have created. What happens when you move your objects further away from your light source? Why do you think this happens?</p> 	<p>Have you ever wondered how children entertained themselves while hiding in underground bunkers during the war? Design a board game or puzzle which they might have enjoyed playing with their families.</p> 
<p>How does music make you feel? Does it calm you, inspire you or energise you? Create a piece of artwork which shares your emotions and feelings when listening to your favourite song, or piece of music? Remember to include the song title and artist.</p> 	<p>Have you ever wondered how electricity passes through a bulb to make light or how a candle creates a flame? Research one of these two light sources and draw a diagram to show what you have learnt. Label your diagram clearly to share your learning.</p> 	<p>Write a poem about life without light. Do we need it? Could we survive without light? What would our lives be like without light?</p> 	<p>Write a letter to members of the Children's Parliament to share ideas of how as a school we could save our energy consumption and protect our planet.</p> 	<p>What is your dream or goal for the rest of this school year? How will you achieve it? Make a list of achievable steps to help you to reach this goal by the time you finish Year 6.</p>

What else would you like to find out?</p> 	<p>Design a new light source to replace light bulbs. Consider how it would work and why it would be an improvement on lightbulbs. Be prepared to present your innovative design to your class to convince them to replace their current lightbulbs with your exciting new creation. Remember to include technical vocabulary and specific details about your invention.</p> 	<p>Write a book review to share your favourite book with your class. A book review template is available from your teacher. Remember to include what the book is about, why you liked it, who you would recommend the book to and why.</p> 	<p>Enjoy a winter woodland walk or take a stroll through your garden.
