<p>Reading at Cherry Tree:</p>	<p>The School Day and Key Dates:</p>
<p>At Cherry Tree we understand the importance of enabling our children to become confident and enthusiastic readers. Reading frequently to children, and engaging them actively in stories, non-fiction, rhymes and poems, will give children the opportunity to thrive.</p> <p>Books are used in every area of our teaching and are an integral part of Cherry Tree School. Please read with your child at home, encourage them to read independently and ensure that a log of their reading is kept in their Reading Record which should be brought into school each day.</p>  <p>(This can include online books, recipes, instructions, shopping lists, letters, postcards, newspapers as well as stories).</p>	<p>Doors will open 8.49am Doors will be locked at 9.00am. Register will be taken before 9am. <p>PE and Outdoor learning</p>	
<p>PE is usually on a Wednesday but we do expect the children to have their PE kits in every day. All PE kit should be named and left in school on your child's peg. It can be taken home at half term to be washed.</p> <p>We are practising getting changed quickly and putting our clothes away. Please make sure all uniform is labelled and children have a chance to practise changing at home to speed up this process!</p> <p>We will be learning outdoors every day. Our outdoor learning 'forest school' lesson will usually be on a Monday. Children should have a coat and wellies left at school.</p>  	
<p>Home Learning:</p>	
<p>It is expected that...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children read every day with an adult who records this in the orange reading record book. • Children to use Numbots to practise Maths at home throughout the week • A 'Home learning Menu' will be sent home at the beginning of each half term. Children should complete 5 home learning tasks each half term (1 a week). These should be completed by the child and be brought back to school for our home learning sharing on the last week. 	

Our themes this term are...

During this half term we will be investigating **What makes Africa great?**

In **Geography** we will learn that there are over 50 different African countries and the landscape is different in each (hot dry deserts, cold mountains or warm wet rainforests). We will learn about the urban landscapes in Nigeria with modern homes and the rural life in the savannah and traditional homes in Kenya. We will learn about weather around the world in **Science** and start to identify how the weather changes each day in the UK. In **Maths** we will recap how to subtract, and become more confident at counting in groups to learn about multiplication and division. We will solve problems involving groups and sharing. In **English** lessons our writing will be based on the stories 'Anna Hibiscus' and 'One day on our blue planet: In the Savanah'. We will learn about shadows, den building and tying knots in **Forest School**. In our **RE** lessons we will learn about the Jewish celebration of 'Shabbat' and discuss the religious celebrations we take part in. In **Music** we will explore creating rhythms and patterns often found in African music. We will use the Chromebooks in **Computing** to create musical patterns. In **Spanish** we will learn to count to 10 and in **PSHE** we will learn about relationships and friendships. In **PE** lessons we will learn about striking and fielding when playing ball games.
