
#### **READING CORNER**

# PARKING

We have seen an increase in the number of complaints from local residents about their drives being blocked at the start and end of school. Also the coach, returning children from a school trip, experienced significant difficulties because of parking on the roundabout. As a result, we are working with our local Community Police Officer to try and improve the situation for our local community. The Community Police Officer will be patrolling before and after school, so please be mindful where and how you park on the school run.



It is so important that children practise their times tables regularly. Little and often is best. 10 minutes each day will ensure they have the facts at their fingertips.

Here are some hints:


- Practise when you're sitting at traffic lights or waiting in the queue at the shops.
- Practise counting in steps as you walk up the stairs or as you get dressed in the morning.
- Make sure you practise one table at a time. Trying to learn too many facts at once can be overwhelming and you'll find the facts don't stick.
- Instead, warm up with a table they know well and then practise a multiplication table where they are unsure of all the answers.
- Use the known facts like 1x, 2x, 5x and 10x to calculate the others.
- Ask your child's teacher if you don't know which table they are working on in class.

• Make your own mini flashcards. Choose one multiplication table (e.g. 3s) Write the times table fact on one side (2 x3) on a piece of paper. Write the answer on the back (6).



- Turn your flash cards into a game. E.g Choose one multiplication table (e.g. 6s) and mix them up, lay them out answer side down. Time yourself calling out the total for all 12 calculations as you turn them over to check.
- Recite your times table. Use an online playlist, there are some on <u>YouTube</u>, or make up your own song or rap.
- Choose one table (e.g. 6) and roll two dice. E.g. They land on 3 and 4 which equals 7. I then calculate 7 x
  6. I say 7x6=42.
- Let your child help if you need to use multiplication to work out quantities for scaling up a recipe, or calculating the price of more than one item of shopping.

Have fun and enjoy practising your multiplication tables! You can find out more by coming along to the Parent Workshop at school on Tuesday 7th February 9.00am - 9.30am or 5.30pm - 6.00pm.
