HINTS FROM THE HUB

We all praise our children, but did you know there are different types of praise...

- <u>Positive Reinforcement</u> praising your child for DOING something by showing that you have noticed what they are choosing to do and that you like it. You can do this by giving them a pat on the back, a thumbs up or high five. You can give your child verbal feedback by saying things like: "Whoah, that is tidy!", "Wow, you're ready for school alteady!", "Thanks for all your help" or simply saying "Well done."
- <u>Praise for being and doing</u> tells someone we value them for who they are. They do not have to consciously earn the praise - it is unconditional. You can show your child this by giving them a hug or telling them: "You're so much fun to be with", " I am so happy to see you", "You're so nice to talk to" or "I love how much energy you have."
