#### FREE SCHOOL MEALS

In a previous newsletter we announced that Hertfordshire County Council had decided that they would not continue to provide digital Supermarket vouchers to children entitled to benefit related free school meals in school holidays. However, the Chancellor announced in the March Budget an extension to the Household Support Fund. As a result, a £30 supermarket voucher will be issued for all children who are entitled to benefit related free school meals. This voucher has now been emailed to those who are entitled.
