Year 1

Writing - writing facts about Castles, who live there and their jobs.

Phonics – Growing the phonics code: Phase 5 /igh/ tie child, time, /ai/ play, acorn snake, /oa/ stone, /ee/ he field, even, beach /oo/ blew, rule, glue, /yoo/ new, use, unicorn.

Maths - finding missing parts on a Cherry model.

Science – which materials float and sink.

Wider Curriculum – building castles in design & technology and learning Christmas themed songs in music.

Year 2

Writing - reading 'A Walk in London' by Salvatore Rubbino and writing information leaflets about London.

Maths - ooking at the 2 and 10 times tables and using this knowledge to solve problems.

Science - investigating the suitability of materials, focusing on testing how waterproof some materials are.

Wider Curriculum – learning how London has changed over time.

Guided Reading – 'The Green Ship' by Quentin Blake.

Year 3

Writing - writing instructions using imperative verbs (e.g grab) and adverbs (e.g carefully).

Maths - solving word problems using adding and subtracting.

Science - researching Mary Anning's discovery and finding out about fossils.

Wider Curriculum - finding out about Stonehenge, cave paintings and the invention of the wheel.

Guided Reading – 'Journey to Jo'burg' by Beverley Naidoo.

Year 4

Writing - Poetry based around the Romans.

Maths - Units of measure and how we can use this knowledge to solve worded problems.

Science - focusing on the functions of teeth.

Wider Curriculum - looking at what the Romans brought to Britain and what elements of Roman life still exist today.

Guided Reading – 'The Firework Makers Daughter' by Philip Pullman.

Year 5

Writing - writing narratives inspired by 'Odd and the Frost Giants' and then exploring features of instructions.

Maths - exploring division and practicing long and short division methods.

Science - investigating forces including water resistance, levers, pulleys and gears.

Wider Curriculum - exploring how the Viking era came to an end and the impact they had on Britain.

Guided Reading – 'Kensuke's Kingdom' by Michael Morpurgo.

Year 6

Writing – writing narratives inspired by the story of Jim in 'Street Child' and biographies about the life of Queen Victoria.

Maths - the areas of parallelograms and triangles and using the formal method of division.

Science - designing and creating toys and games that use electrical circuits.

Wider Curriculum -exploring and evaluating how Britain changed under the rule of Queen Victoria.

Guided Reading – 'Private Peaceful' by Michael Morpurgo.
