LEARNING

Our Curriculum

The Cherry Tree Curriculum has been designed specifically for our children, to help them understand their place in the world, and to enable them to progressively reflect on how they are valued in the local and global community. The lines of enquiry we explore, build on their own experiences and enable them to make connections across time and place.

We place a great emphasis on teaching our children the essential skills of English and Mathematics to underpin cross curricular learning. Maths is taught discretely using the Herts for Learning weekly steps. Writing outcomes are mapped using the Hertfordshire long term plans and set within the context of the half termly topics to provide inspiration and motivation for our young writers. Books are also at the heart of our learning ethos and a wide range of high-quality texts, both fiction and nonfiction will be delved into, to excite and enhance each theme.

Our beliefs and promises are woven through the curriculum to provide a firm foundation on which



our children can 'learn together and learn for life'. There are six overarching themes that all year groups will explore at the same time, allowing the whole school community to investigate collaboratively and share what has been discovered through assemblies, class partnerships and open classrooms.

Our Outside Education Programme offers all children the opportunity to explore, discover and interact with nature in the safety of our beautiful school grounds. Outdoor sessions are linked to the topics being investigated in the classroom to complement and broaden the children's learning.

Forest School is very much part of this holistic outlook of our school and specifically provides wonderful opportunities for our children to develop valuable life skills, confidence and a growth mindset that will benefit them throughout their lives. Where possible we work with natural or recycled materials in order to promote an awareness of the environment both locally and globally. We also involve our children in sustainability projects within our school to ensure that future generations will benefit from their generosity.

Our EYFS Curriculum

Teaching in the Nursery and Reception classrooms is based upon the Early Years Outcomes curriculum. The curriculum programme provides effective education for children aged 3 - 5 years, and is supported by well-informed staff who understand the rapid development of an Early Years child. It requires Early Years practitioners to review children's progress and share a summary with parents at two points:

Between the ages of 24 and 36 months via the progress check and at the end of reception via the EYFS profile. Structured play and careful monitoring are the foundation stones of this stage of education.

Phonics

We teach children to read and write using the Letters and Sounds scheme. We use a wealth or resources to support this. Children have daily sessions in small groups appropriate to their level of understanding, taught by adults trained to deliver specialised phonics provision.

Adults in the classroom

Children are additionally supported in class by highly skilled and compassionate support staff who provide targeted interventions and in addition to guiding children through class learning.

Contacting Your Teacher

We pride ourselves on being approachable. Teachers are happy to talk with you before or after school and can answer more in depth enquiries by email via admin@cherrytree.herts.sch.uk.

Home Learning

The purpose of homework is to provide children opportunities to enhance and practice their learning or study skills. This may take the form of shared reading; spellings or tables to learn; individual research for a topic and may reflect any aspect of the curriculum. We expect parents/carers to hear their child read every day and comment in their reading record book, as well as ensure that their child completes other work as set.

Children will be given instructions about how to do the work before they take it home but parent co-operation is encouraged in assisting their child to develop a responsible attitude to homework.

Please speak to your child's class teacher to discuss this further. They'd be happy to help.

Attendance and Punctuality

While we understand that at times your child may be ill, we expect your child to attend school regularly. Please avoid arranging appointments in school time. Your child should have attendance of 97% or above to give them the best chance of making excellent progress. School attendance is regularly monitored and you will be contacted if concerns arise. Good attendance is vital for you child to make good progress in their learning and for them to form and maintain positive relationships in school.

Late for School

Arriving late for the start of the school day can be very distressing for a child and disruptive to the whole class. Parents are asked to make every effort to ensure their child is in school on time, with the correct equipment and ready to learn. Lateness and poor attendance are monitored regularly by the Attendance Improvement Officer from Hertfordshire County Council. If your child arrives after 9.00am, they must come into the school via the School Office and sign into the Children's Signing In system.

Children are the responsibility of their parents and carers outside these hours. Children should not be on the school site before 8.40am or after 3.30pm unless they are attending a before or after school club.

If Your Child is ill

If your child is absent from school, please call the school office on 01923 245490 before 9.00 a.m. Our office has a voicemail service with an option to leave an absence message. Alternatively, email admin@cherrytree.herts.sch.uk.

Children who have vomited or had diarrhoea should not return to school until 24 hours after their last episode.

Holidays in Term Time

We do not expect children to take holidays in term time. To ensure that your child's progress is not affected, fines will be given for unauthorised term time holiday absence. This will emphasise, in the eyes and understanding of your child, the importance you attach to work at school. Our Notification of Absence Form for exceptional circumstances is available from the school office and will need supporting evidence.

Extra Curricular Clubs

There are a lot of opportunities to join one of the many before or after school clubs. Example of clubs include Football, Gymnastics, Maths, Multi-Skills, and Street Dance. Details of the clubs are publicised on our website.





School Lunch

Personal Belongings

No valuables should be brought into school. Money should not be brought in unless it is for a specific purpose e.g. dress-down day. Jewellery should not be worn as it constitutes a Health and Safety risk, please see our School Uniform Policy for further information. Cherry Tree Primary School cannot be held responsible for any loss or damage to personal property.

Mobile Phones

The school recognises that as technology has changed more pupils have access to mobile phones. We will take steps to guide children to help them understand that this technology should be used responsibly. We are happy for mobile phones to be brought to school for children from Year 5 & 6; however, we ask that children hand them to the school office at the beginning of the school day for safe keeping and collect them at the home time. Cherry Tree Primary School cannot be held responsible for any loss or damage to personal property including mobile phones.





Parking

To ensure the safety of our children at the beginning and end of the school day, parents must not drive into the school car park unless they are collecting a sick child. If there are extenuating circumstances such as a disability or illness, permission to use the car park must be requested from the Headteacher.

There are parking restrictions outside the school and we understand that parking in the local vicinity is very difficult. Please be considerate to our neighbours.

Medicines

DfE guidelines recommend that we do not administer medicines routinely to children unless they have a chronic or life threatening condition. Should your child require medicine during school hours, you are welcome to come and administer it in school, however, it is worth asking your GP if he can prescribe medicine that does not need to be taken during school hours. If your child does need to take long term prescribed medication, please speak to the School Office staff to complete the relevant forms. Asthma inhalers are kept in the children's classrooms and parents/carers are requested to complete an annual Asthma Maintenance Plan. For children who need Auto-injectors at school, parents must provide the school with an annual Allergy Action Plan. It is the parent/carers responsibility to ensure the relevant forms are completed and for ensuring that all medicines are in date.

School Uniform Including P.E.





At Cherry Tree Primary School we believe that the wearing of school uniform provides pupils with a sense of pride in their school and promotes a feeling of community and belonging. All clothing must be named.

Children have the option of wearing the following:

- Red logo sweatshirt/cardigan
- White logo polo shirt
- Grey trousers (or shorts in summer), grey skirt or pinafore dress, or red and white gingham dress in Summer
- Grey plain socks or tights
- Optional hijab black and tight fitting
- Black shoes (no boots, trainers or open toed sandals)

For P.E.:

- White logo t-shirt
- Red shorts
- Black plimsolls/trainers
- In cooler months, for outdoor PE, Year 1 to 6 can wear a plain dark sweatshirt and jogging bottoms

Optional items:

- Grey logo bookbag
- · Grey logo fleece to be worn as a coat or additional layer in the Winter
- · Grey logo hat/scarf

Please note: plimsolls/trainers must be in school every day. Boots can be worn to school in the winter but children must change into shoes or plimsolls in the class. No extreme haircuts please.

PASTORAL CARE

Keeping Our Children Safe

At Cherry Tree, we do everything we can to ensure that the safety and wellbeing of all of our children is our highest priority. In order to do this, a wide range of measures are put in place:

- All staff appointed to work in our school have a criminal records search called a DBS check.
- Every member of our staff receives regular First Aid training and there are a number of first aid kits situated in school.

• Children are supervised at all times. We ask that you also take responsibility for our site security and encourage you to report any concerns to the school office.

• We have strict procedures for the collection of children. No child will be allowed to leave school with an unknown adult. Please contact the school office if you need to notify of a change to collection arrangements.

• If a child's attendance or punctuality causes concern, the school may work closely with the Local Authority's Attendance Officer.

• We have designated Child Protection/Safeguarding staff as well as a detailed Child Protection Policy, which is reviewed annually and is available to view on our website. All staff and Governors have appropriate Child Protection training, which is updated at least every three years.

• Children are encouraged to use the internet, but at all times in a safe way. Pupils are never left unattended whilst online.

• We have high expectations for good behaviour. Our Behaviour Policy shows our strong emphasis on positive approaches, but also our clear boundaries in responding to behaviour choices that may impact on the learning, wellbeing or safety of others.

• We do not tolerate bullying in our school community, and as soon as we are aware of an issue we act promptly and effectively.

• We have a clear Whistleblowing Policy and if members of staff have any concerns about people working within the school, paid or unpaid, they have a professional duty to inform the Headteacher or Governing body accordingly.

• Our Health and Safety policy is reviewed annually by our staff and Governors and is available to view on our website.

Pastoral Teams

The Pastoral Support Team works with children in school to help them access all aspect of school life. We can offer a range of individual or group therapeutic interventions which aim to improve the Mental Health and Wellbeing of our children. Please see the attached leaflet for more information on what we provide.

We are embedding the Six Principles of Nurture across the school to develop a nurturing culture that promotes healthy outcomes for children by focusing on emotional needs and development as well as academic learning. Our six principles of nurture are:

- 1. We all learn in our own way and in our own time
- 2. We feel safe at Cherry Tree School
- 3. We care for our own and other's wellbeing
- 4. We use the Zones of Regulation to talk about how we feel
- 5. Our behaviour shows you how we are feeling
- 6. Things will change and that is okay.

House System

The children are allocated a house group, Diamond, Ruby, Emerald or Sapphire, when they first start school. They stay in this house throughout their time in school. They can earn house points through good behaviour and having a positive attitude to learning and promoting the school beliefs and promises. We also have competitive sporting events throughout

the year.

Beliefs and Promises

Every half term we promote and focus on one of our school beliefs and promises. During the half term, children are recognised and celebrated for demonstrating the belief or promise and at the end of the half term, two children from each class are presented with a medal.

Behaviour

Enjoying and doing well at school is an important factor for the healthy development of children. Some children find the structure and demands of school life challenging and this can be worrying and upsetting at times.

We believe that a strong partnership between the school, children and parents is crucial in promoting good behaviour and a positive culture for learning. Our school ethos guides and supports our pupils in a positive way as they develop and grow to be good citizens.

We encourage our children to behave well and have positive attitudes to learning by rewarding them in a variety of ways:

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Free School Meals

We would like to remind parents that if you are in receipt of certain benefits you may be eligible to claim for free school meals. The process is very easy. Every student who successfully claims for a free lunch, ensures that the school is awarded extra money from the government.

Pupil Premium Grant

The Pupil Premium Grant is an allocation of additional funding from the Government to support specific groups of children aged 4 and over, in year groups Reception to Year 6. Schools decide how to use this grant as they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for these pupils. The school publishes an annual report on how we use the funding.

The Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP) is additional funding for early years settings to improve the education they provide for 3 and 4 year olds.

If your child is eligible for Pupil Premium, then you may also receive additional support with some other school costs such as uniform, swimming lessons and class visits.

Payments

Our school is cashless and all payments should be made on Arbor for items such as school lunches, trips and swimming. It is easy to set up an account by visiting www.cherrytree-primary.uk.arbor.sc/ The only exception to being cashless is money sent in for charity days and also any payments to The Friends of Cherry Tree, our PTA.

The Friends of Cherry Tree are a group of supportive and dedicated parent and carer volunteers who plan and organise events to fundraise for the school. Events include discos, cake sales, and fairs. In recent years they have contributed towards the indoor climbing frame, new stage in the Hall, stage lighting, outdoor play equipment and our Outdoor Classroom. All parents, teachers and the whole of the 'Cherry Tree Primary School' community are automatically members of the "Friends".
